



A Draft of a Tract of Land Situate in the Long Swamp Township in the County of Berks in the State of Pennsylvania Containing Sixty one acres and 156 Perches of Land. Together with the usual allowance at Six per Cent for Roads. Now belonging to Jacob Long. Being part of a Tract of 108 Acres and 146 Perches of Land & allowance. That was formerly Surveyed to Samuel Burger, By virtue of a Warrant from the Hon<sup>ble</sup> Proprietaries of the 14<sup>th</sup> November Anno. 1744. - who afterward sold his Right to the above Tract to the said Jacob Long and the remainder to Philip Basters. Divided for them on the 24<sup>th</sup> February Anno 1769. And now Resurveyed on the 3<sup>d</sup> September Anno 1781 in Pursuance of a Warrant of Resurvey and by Order of the Surveyor General. Dated the 22<sup>d</sup> August Anno 1781.
