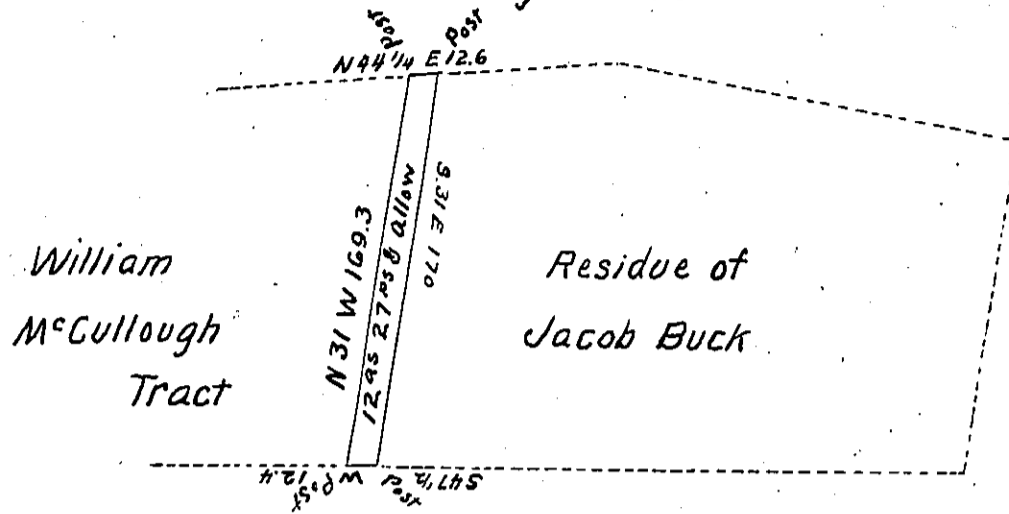


Abraham Mothersbough's Heirs

Surveyed for Jemima Mothersbough, the 16<sup>th</sup> day of July 1872, being part of a larger tract of two hundred and fifty seven acres, thirteen perches and allowance, originally surveyed in pursuance of a Warrant granted to Jacob Buck, dated the tenth day of August 1765.
