



Situate in Town now Peach Bottom Township in the County of York Containing as above set forth 57<sup>as</sup> & 21 perches and allowance being part of a larger Tract of 122<sup>as</sup> & 74 perches and allowance which was originally surveyed on the 29<sup>th</sup> Day of October A<sup>D</sup> 1744 in pursuance of a Warrant granted to Thomas Bowles bearing date the 19<sup>th</sup> June A<sup>D</sup> 1744. Resurveyed the 22<sup>nd</sup> Day of May A<sup>D</sup> 1810 excluding the part which had been taken in at making the original Survey in the State of Maryland. And now on the 18<sup>th</sup> Day of August A<sup>D</sup> 1838 the above part is again resurveyed, calculated, corrected and is now returned for confirmation, at the request of James Ramsay the present owner who wishes to patent it.
