Being a part of a larger tract of land containing 330 acres and allowance; originally surveyed in pursuance of Joseph Roberts's Application No 1675, dated the 27<sup>th</sup> day of October, 1766.

The red lines represent a survey of 137 ac 162 p. & all made in pursuance of a warrant granted to Joseph Norris, dated the 11<sup>th</sup> day of March, 1793.
