Purvins my predecessor Dec<sup>d</sup>. the other piece being part of the North side of the tract improved by the heirs of Daniel M<sup>d</sup> Deavitt Dec<sup>d</sup> containing one hundred and fifty one acres and one hundred and thirteen perches and the Allowance, Surveyed for Jacob Covert by virtue of his improvement and Residence on the 18<sup>th</sup> of Septem<sup>r</sup> 1830 by myself the whole being <sup>situate</sup> on the Waters of Slipperyrock Creek Slipperyrock Township Pittet County
