



I, the undersigned County Surveyor of the County of Westmoreland, Do hereby Certify that I have examined the Diagram of Survey of Mr Chambers Marnea letter B. Containing 107⁹³ 71 prs & all. Surveyed by Geo. Mechling Esq. 10th Febr. 1847. to be Correct. Given Under my hand the 30th of October 1868

The above described Tract of land Marked A, B, C & D is situated on the Youghiogheny River in South huntingdon township Westmoreland County formerly Bedford County. Containing 303⁹³ 64 prs & allowance. Which was Surveyed in pursuance of an Order No 1077 dated the 3rd day of April 1769 for John McPherson and returned to the land Office of Penn^a and whereas James Carrothers became lawfully possessed of the parts marked A & B of which he died intestate possessed thereof in fee leaving a Widow and two Children and whereas afterwards on proceedings in Partition in the Orphans Court of Westmoreland City the part marked letter A. was assigned by said Court to the Widow of said deceased, and afterwards patented to her. And the part Marked letter B. Containing 107⁹³ 71 prs and allowance was assigned by said Court to James Chambers in right of his wife ^{Julyanno} daughter of the deceased, which is not yet patented. Now the said Chambers is desirous in having his part patented and wishing to have directions necessary from you for the same, and also the intire Cost of the same. as he is now prepared with means to take the patent. I Surveyed the land for Mr Carrothers in his life time and also Surveyed and divided it for his heirs on proceedings of partition and afterwards made the return of Survey for the Widow for the part A. Patented, and had also made the Diagram for Mr Chambers part for patenting when County Surveyor, which I suppose must now be Certified by the present Cty Surveyor. Please give all necessary directions and Cost of patenting. And direct to me at Greensburg & oblige.
