 a certain Improvement on which the said Warrant was in part founded  
 &c. And Resurveyed the 16th. and 17th. days of January 1811. thereby em-  
 bracing the House and improvement &c. in Obedience to a decree of the  
 Honorable Board of Property dated 12th. January 1810 - Entered in Minute  
 Book N<sup>o</sup> 7 folio 519 - Certified so to be by the Secretary of the Land  
 Office on the 13th. January 1810 - And to me directed by Andrew Porter  
 Esquire Surveyor General  
 To Andrew Porter Esquire pr. Alexander McGlean Deputy
