



In Pursuance of a Warrant <sup>to me directed</sup> granted to Isaac Haines and others, for Resurveying the Northern Part of the Nottingham Lots (originally Survey'd in 1702) bearing Date the 29th. of November 1787, the above was Survey'd for William Churchman on the 3rd. day of the 5th. month <sup>called Fair-hill</sup> 1788, Beginning at a Stone then Planted & fixed by agreement, at the North-West corner of the Tract, a small distance Westward of a young Black-Walnut tree &c. Certify'd the 24th. of the 6th. mo. 1788 By
