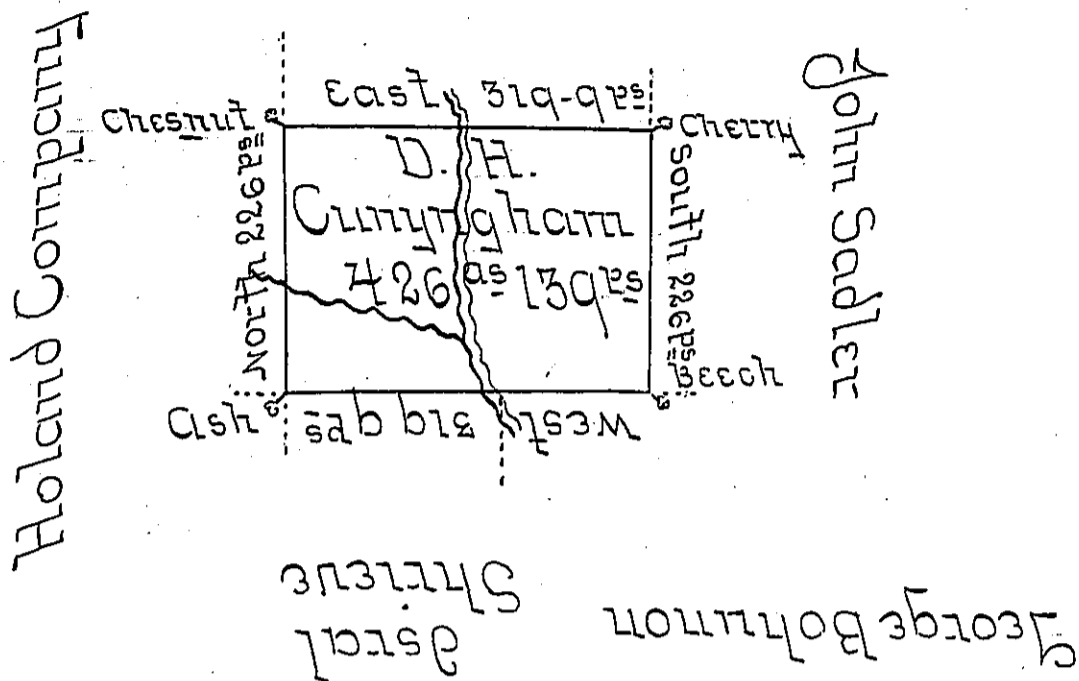


Francis West



In Pursuance of a warrant for 400 acres dated the 30<sup>th</sup> day of May A.D. 1792 granted to D. H. Cuyngnam was surveyed on the 12<sup>th</sup> day of June 1817. The above described tract of land containing 426<sup>as</sup> acres 139<sup>ps</sup> perches and allowance of six percent for roads, &c. situated in Bloomfield Township Crawford county, and at the time of making the same, John Taylor was residing thereon, and there was built a house fit for the habitation of man, and there appears to be upwards of 15 acres of the land cleared, fenced and in a state of cultivation, and that the same was divided as above stated, between
