



In pursuance of an Ord^r from the Commissioner of ^{the} ~~obl~~ ^{obl} ~~perty~~ ^{perty} dated the 16th day of June 1772 a survey was made on the 3^d day of July ~~obl~~ ^{obl} 72 for Robert Deshea on a certain Lot of Ground situate in the Town of Sunbury in the County of Northumb^r marked in a General Pl^{an} of said Town Number Two Hundred and Seventy Seven, Containing in Breadth North and South on Broad Way fifty Seven feet Six Inches, and in Length East and West Two Hundred and thirty feet, Bounded Westward by Broad Way, Northward by Hurtleberry Street, Eastward by River Alley, and Southward by Lot Number Two Hundred and Seventy Eight. Returned into the Secretary's Office the 23^d day of April 1776 for David Duncan
