Randolph, the above described tract of Land (Called Partnership) Containing four Hundred and thirty one acres forty six perches and allowance of six Per Cent. for Roads &c. Situate on the West side of French Creek in Sadesbery township Crawford County Commonwealth of Pennsylvania (including part of Casewaga Creek) and at the time of surveying the aforesaid William Denny and Esek F. Randolph was actually Living on the same with their families and had Each of them Large and valuable improvements, and they had more than Eighty acres of the land Cleared fenced and in a good state of Cultivation good houses and barns and one sawmill
