



Situate in Dublin Township Huntingdon County near Mairs Gap on the waters of Little Aughwick Creek Resurveyed May 5th 1795 In pursuance of a Warrant for one hundred Acres dated the 4th day of June 1762 containing one hundred & ninety one Acres and one hundred & forty two perches and the usual allowance of Six per Cent for Roads.
