Dear Sir, Nathaniel Cooper of this County, lately obtained a Patent from the Commonwealth, calling for 120 A. 51 pr. of land, bounded by Zebulon Cooper on the west - Accadamy land on the east - Situated in Mercer Township. This Patent issued on Survey made by Thomas Graham, former Deputy Surveyor of this County; on the 28th Oct. 1813. on a warrant granted to Mr. Cooper, dated 2d day of March 1812. - A Certified return of which was made to your office by T. H. Lyon late Deputy Surveyor of this County.

Mr. Graham Committed an error in his entry of this Survey, by stating that the land lay in Mercer Township, instead of Slipperyrock T.P. which Mr. Cooper desires the Officers of the Land office Department to have corrected in his Patent. If the request of Mr. Cooper is Granted, I will note the error on the record of Mr. Graham. In order to Justify the officers of the land office to make the correction desired by Mr. Cooper, I do officially certify that Mr. Coopers land lies wholly in Slipperyrock Township and no part of it in Mercer T.P. Given under my hand this 23d day of March A.D. 1841.
