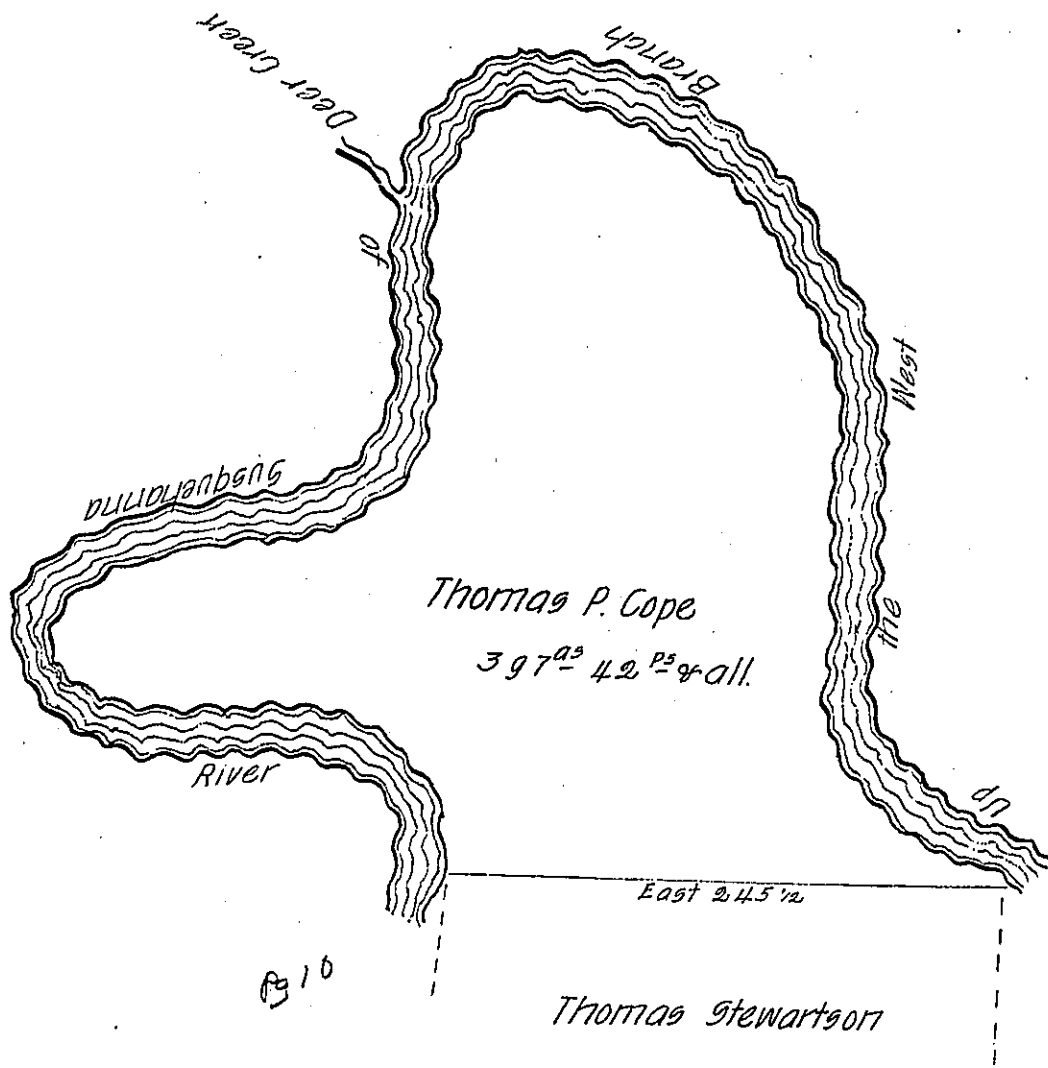

Cope in pursuance of a Warrant dated the 15<sup>th</sup> Day of March 1797.
