



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the first day of March 1734/5. Surveyed to Edward Farmer a tract of Land Called Poplar Neck Situate on the East Side of the River Schuylkill in the County of Philad<sup>a</sup>. Beginning at a post a Corner of 50<sup>as</sup> of land laid out to Benjamin Fairman & Peter Rambo thence by the same North Seventy degrees East fifty Six perches to a ~~post~~ <sup>Red Oak</sup> thence by y<sup>e</sup> 5<sup>d</sup> land South Twenty Degrees East one hundred Sixty three perches to a post thence by the 5<sup>d</sup> land South Seventy degrees West forty Seven perches to a Black Oak on the Bank of 5<sup>d</sup> River thence down the several Courses there of five Hundred & Ninety perches to a Hickory tree Standing on the Bank of 5<sup>d</sup> River thence by Vacant land South Eighty degrees West two Hundred & four perches to a Black Oak Mark<sup>d</sup> for a Corner thence down the 5<sup>d</sup> River Schuylkill to the place of Beginning. Containing three hundred Seventy five acres with the usual Allowance of Six p— Cent.
