



Situated on --- Little Redstone creek in Washington Township Fayette County and Surreyed the 26th Day of March 1785, In Pursuance of a Certificate granted by the Commissioners Appointed by the State of Virginia &c of which the following is a true Copy. — We the Commissioners appointed for adjusting the Claims to unpatented land in the Counties of Monongalia, Yohogania, and Ohio do hereby Certify that Thomas Freeman is entitled to Two Hundred and Forty five Acres of Land. Situate lying and being in the County of Yohogania on little Redstone to include his Settlement made in the year of our Lord one Thousand Seven Hundred and Seventy Five.

Given under our Hands at Redstone old Fort this Third day of Nove^rember 1779 in the fourth Year of the Commonwealth.
