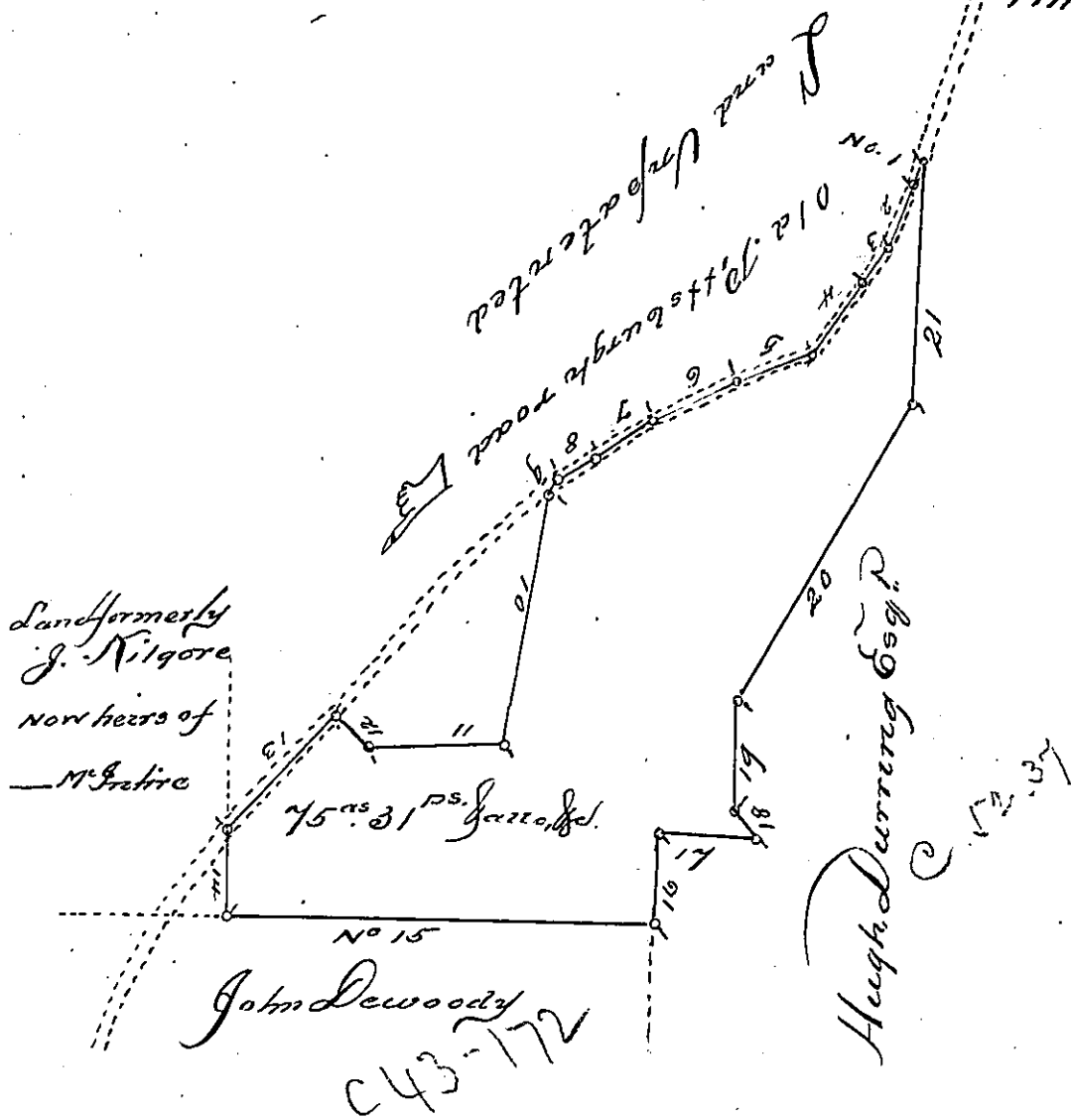


Courses & distances of the tract below
