



In pursuance of a Warrant of 400 acres, dated the tenth day of April 1793, granted to George Elly was Surveyed on the 24th day of September 1822 the above described tract of Land containing 408 acres 127 perches of land and allowance of Six per cent for roads &c. Situate in Sadsbury township Crawford County Pa. adjoining land land granted to Nathan Elly; and at the time of making the Same John Smith was residing thereon and there was built a house fit for the habitation of man and there appeared to be upwards of forty acres of land cleared fenced and in a State of cultivation and having examined the lines and courses on the ground found the Same to be correct and that John Smith is residing on the Same at this time.
