SITUATE on the north side of Saltlick Creek in Saltlick township Fayette County and Surveyed the 20<sup>th</sup> day of May 1834 In Pursuance of a Warrant in the name of Clifford Elder for 150 acres of improved land dated the 30<sup>th</sup> day of May 1832, there is on this tract about 20 acres of cleared land, an old cabin not now occupied, and a schoolhouse; the improvement appears to be 20 or 25 years old

Note - as the papers relating to some of the adjoining could not be had, and the timber is much destroyed in some places, it is not entirely certain that we have run upon all the old lines of Binks, Haines & Herhold; it is believed that the line of Haines from near the poplar, is more correctly represented by the dotted line; but, as all the land now belong to one person, <sup>as</sup> he is satisfied with <sup>the</sup> lines as above. I return them as they are. The old lines marks of Binks and Haines are mostly destroyed.
