



The Land above described is Situate in Little <sup>Britain</sup> Township Lancaster County, the Tract of 31° 25' & allowance was Survey'd for Henry Reynolds senior by order on his Application, N<sup>o</sup> 2518 dated 21<sup>st</sup> April 1767. & return'd by Jasper Scull, - William Haines having since purchased the Right of the said Henry, both of the Patented Tract, & the above Addition; On trying some of the Lines lately, there appeared to be a small Vacancy of 8 acres & a quarter & allowance, adjoining the Patented Land, on the other side thereof, as above described at A, which was partly improved, & in Possession of Joseph (Son of William Haines). I thought it not improper to describe the same as it lays in this new Draught of both; thinking that perhaps the order was not filled up with the former Survey, & so might include this Piece also, or that it might be otherwise secured to William Haines, as it lays most contiguous to the middle of his Tract, & appears no injury to any other Person; Survey'd the 8<sup>th</sup> of the 5<sup>th</sup> mo. 1785 & Certify'd By
