



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the Third day of September 1734 Surveyed unto Jacob Faux a tract of Land Situate in Frederick Township in the County of Philad^a. Beginning at a post a Corner of Jacob Mechlins land thence by land of Christian Taylor North Nine Degrees East one Hundred and Thirty perches to a post thence by s^d Taylor's land North East Twenty four perches to a post in a line of Adam Hill's land thence by the same South East forty Seven perches to a post thence by s^d Hill's land North East Thirty one perches to a post thence by Vacant land South East one hundred and Twenty Seven perches to a post thence by Vacant land South West Eighty Two perches to a Black Oak in a line of Jacob Mechlins land thence by the same North West forty four perches to a post thence by s^d Mechlin's Land South Seventy Nine degrees West Ninety five perches to the place of Beginning Containing one hundred acres with the usual allowance of Six $\frac{1}{2}$ Cent. Surveyed 9^{br} 8th 1734.
