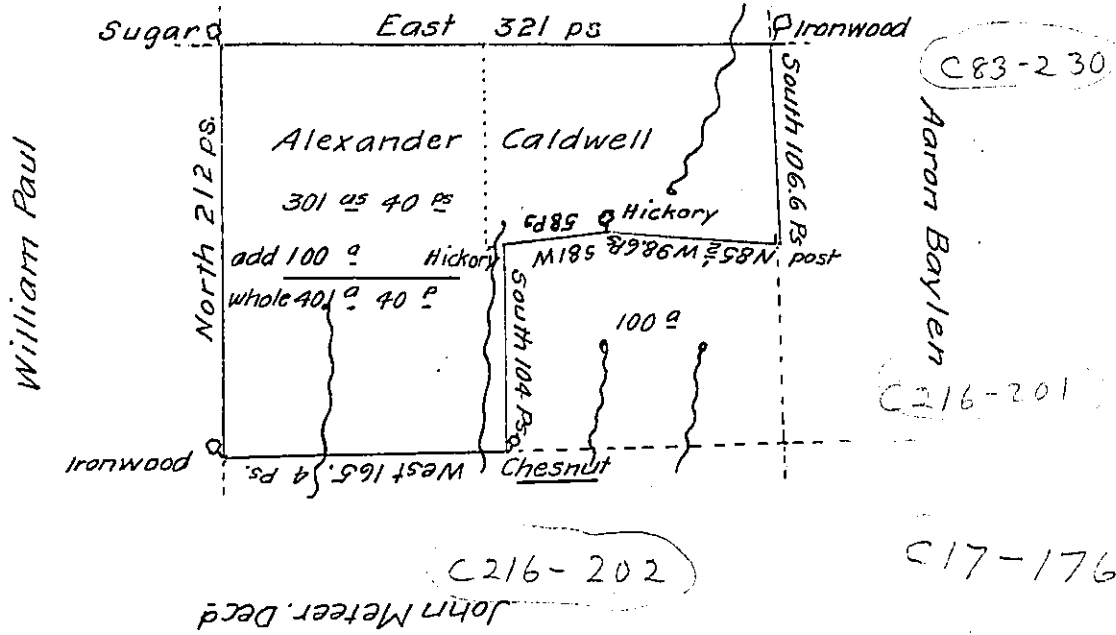

In persuance of a warrant of 400 acs dated the 15th day of July A.D. 1816 was surveyed the 2d day of January 1827 for the use of the legal heirs and representitives of Alexander Caldwell, now Decd the above described peace of land containing three hundred one acres, forty perches and allowance of six per cent for roads &c. the residue of the whole tract containing one hundred acres, and allowance of six per cent, for roads, &c. was surveyed for Charles Caldwell son. of the Alexander in persuance of an agreement baring date the 28th day of January A.D. 1818 Between the said Alexander Caldwell in his lifetime and his said son Charles Caldwell. Situate in Fairfield Township Crawford County Pennsylvania and that Jesse Powel was reciding within ^{the} lines of the aforesaid 301 acs 40 ps of land & had a house fit for the habitation of man & there aperd to be cleared fenced, and in a state of cultivation, upwards of ten acres, and clames 100 acs &c. of the same agreeabl to line run and marked on the ground as above represented by a dotted line, it being the Northeast corner of the whole tract by agreement with ^{the} heirs of the said
