



A Draught of a small Island situate in the River Susquehanna in Marlick Township and County of Lancaster containing Four acres & three quarters of an acre of Land (called Battery Island) Surveyed in pursuance of a Warrant dated the 21<sup>st</sup> day of October 1806 Granted to Alexander Gordon. Surveyed the 4<sup>th</sup> Nov 1806 p<sup>o</sup>.
