



Both the above surveys situate on the East Side of Castleman's river (which was also called Little Yough) in Elklick Township, formerly Bedford, now Somerset County & Surveyed the 27<sup>th</sup> day of Jan<sup>y</sup> 1826: the 1<sup>st</sup> [which is represented in Green] <sup>nd</sup> sur: in pursuance of a Warrant to John Durst or Dust for 100<sup>a</sup> dated 8<sup>th</sup> May 1795, & the other for 196<sup>a</sup> Granted to Abm Beechee Ex<sup>r</sup> of George A Kurtz Dec<sup>d</sup> in trust &c dated the 5<sup>th</sup> day of Jan<sup>y</sup> 1826 Certified this 7<sup>th</sup> day of Sep<sup>r</sup> 1826
