



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Honble Proprietaries bearing date the 31<sup>st</sup> day of October Anno Dom. 1739 surveyed to James Hall a Tract of Land in Donegal Township, containing one hundred acres with the further addition also of sixty ~~one~~ acres, Beginning at a marked Hickory a corner of Ephraim Little's Land thence North 60. East one hundred ninety six perches to a white oak, thence north one hundred & eleven per. to a white oak, thence south 60. west 140 per. to a Black Oak, thence North 30 West 80 per to a Black Oak, thence south 60. West 141 per to a white oak, thence south 30. E. of 3 1/2 - to a post, thence North 50. E. 20 per to a Black Oak, thence South 40. E. 57. - to the place of Beginning, Containing in the whole one hundred & sixty ~~one~~ acres, with the usual allowance of six acres for Roads &c, Surveyed the 20<sup>th</sup> day of March Anno Dom. 1739/40
