



In Pursuance of a Warrant for 400 acres dated the twenty first day of April A.D. 1794 granted to Andrew Greble. Was surveyed on the fourth day of December A.D. 1817, the foregoing described tract of land containing 384 acres, 136 perches and allowance of six per cent for roads & C. Situated in Cassewago township Crawford County, and at the time of making the same Edward Sweney was residing thereon, and there was built, a house fit for the habitation of man, and there appeared to be upwards of twenty acres of the land cleared, fenced and in a state of cultivation, and that the same was divided as above stated, between the legal Heirs and Representatives of Bartholomew Macbride late of Crawford County deceased, agreeable to his last Will and Testament - said Heirs being of full age and all concerned, present, and consented to the same.
