



A Draught of one hundred and ninety nine acres and sixty five perches of land with six per Cent for roads situate—Kishacoquilles valley in Armah township in Mifflin County, which appears, from field notes remaining in my Office to have been surveyed 25<sup>th</sup> June 1808 in pursuance of a warrant to Robert Glass, for 200<sup>9</sup> dated the 5<sup>th</sup> of January 1808. Calculated & drft<sup>d</sup> 13<sup>th</sup> July 1812.

Notes An actual settlement said to have been on this land at time of survey and I believe a family to be on it at this time.
