



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries Dated the Twenty Seventh day of February 1733 Surveyed to John Adam a certain Tract of Land Situate in Oley in the County of Philad^a Beginning at a white Oak a Corner of Martin Pumperny's land thence by the Same South Sixty Degrees West one hundred and Twenty perches and the same Course by Vacant Land Thirty perches to a post thence by Vacant Land North West one hundred & fifty Eight perches to a Corner Stone thence by Vacant Land North East one hundred & forty three perches to a Corner Stone thence by Vacant Land South East Sixty four perches and by Land of Casper Fulwiler the Same Course one hundred & Thirty four perches to the place of Beginning Containing one hundred and fifty Acres with the usual allowance of Six P Cent. Surveyed April 24 1734
