



By virtue of warrant from the Hon^rble proprietaries bearing Date the sixth day
of June Anno Dom^r 1738. I have surveyed and laid out unto Samuel Hendricks on
Conewago Creek in the County of Lancaster on the west side Susquehanna
river two hundred fifty seven acres of land and sixty four p_{ec}ches with allowance
of six p_{ec}ent. Beginning at a white oak by the said creek thence South twenty
five degrees westerly fifty four p_{ec}ches to a white oak thence South twelve degrees
westerly sixty p_{ec}ches to a white oak thence South twenty five degrees westerly
sixty three p_{ec}ches to a black oak thence South fifty degrees westerly seventy
three p_{ec}ches to a Spanish oak thence North eighty nine degrees westerly one
hundred and twenty p_{ec}ches to a Hicker by the said creek thence down the
same traversing the several courses there of near about four hundred and
eighty p_{ec}ches to the place of beginning
