



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Hon^{ble} Proprietaries bearing Date the sixth day of June Anno Dom^o / 1738. I have surveyed and laid out unto Samuel Hendricks on Conewago Creek in the County of Lancaster on the west side Susquehanna river Two hundred fifty seven acres of land and sixty four p^{ches} with allowance of six p^{Cent}. Beginning at a white oak by the said creek thence South twenty five degrees westerly fifty four p^{ches} to a white oak Thence South twelve degrees Westerly sixty p^{ches} to a white oak Thence South twenty five degrees Westerly sixty three p^{ches} to a black oak Thence South fifty degrees westerly seventy three p^{ches} to a spanish oak Thence North eighty nine degrees Westerly one hundred and twenty p^{ches} to a Hicker by the said creek Thence down the same traversing the several courses there of near about four hundred and eighty p^{ches} to the place of beginning
