

A Draft of a tract of Land situate (formerly in Antrim Township in the County of Lancaster but now) in Montgomery Township in the County of Franklin Containing One hundred and fifty acres and 103 perches and an allowance of six p cent for roads &c. Survey'd May 18<sup>th</sup> 1787 in pursuance of a Warrant granted to Archibald Huston bearing Date the 4<sup>th</sup> Day of May 1744.
