



A Draught of a Survey called "The Parsonage" situate on Millars Run in Washington County contain<sup>g</sup> 305 Ac.<sup>s</sup> 106<sup>ps</sup> Strict measure executed Nov. 24<sup>th</sup> 1787 for Obediah Holmes ass<sup>ce</sup> of Tho<sup>s</sup> Hardy in consequence of a certif<sup>e</sup> for 400 Ac.<sup>s</sup> granted to s<sup>r</sup> Hardy by the commiss<sup>rs</sup> appointed by Virginia to adjust the claims to unpatented lands in the Counties Mon<sup>g</sup> & Yohg<sup>a</sup> & Ohio & duly entered &c.
