



By virtue of a warrant from the Proprietor dated the 19th of September 16th 1737, the above described Tract of Land, was surveyed unto Frederick Beckel in the township of Heidelberg in the County of Lancaster. Beginning at a post, a corner of the land of Henry Shugart, thence North 50 degrees west by the same and Vacant Land 146 perches to a small Hickory, thence North 40 degrees East by Vacant Land 146 perches to a Chestnut Oak, thence South 50 Deg^s East by Vacant Land 175 perches to a small Black Oak, thence South 40 degrees West by Vacant Land 146 perches to y^e place of Beginning, containing 150 acres beside y^e allowance of six percent for Roads.
