



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the 16<sup>th</sup> day of March Anno Domini 1733, the Surveyed on the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of May, 1738 to Joseph Hoff, a Tract of Land Situated in the Township of Perstony in the County of Lancaster, Beginning at a Red Oak stand by the River Susquehanna by thence East fifty three perches to a Black Oak, thence South fifty two degrees and a half Easterly one hundred and forty six per. to a Locust, thence South Seventy three degrees Easterly forty per. to a post, in the marsh, thence South one hundred and nine per. to a post, in the Marsh, thence West and by North two hundred fifty four per. to a Chestnut oak by the River Susquehanna, thence up the River by its several courses one hundred and sixty eight perches to the place of beginning containing one hundred and twenty three acres and the allowance of six acres per Cent for Roads and High Ways.
