


James Mayes

By Order of the Proprietary Surveyed on the twenty seventh day of March Anno Domini 1738. to David Hay a Tract of Land situate in the Township of Donegal in the County of Lancaster. Beginning at a White oak standing on the side of Sickasawung Creek, thence west 114 perches to a White Oak, thence North by west 180 perches to a White Oak, thence west 120 per to a Black Oak, thence South west by South 140 perches to a post, thence South 100 perches to a White Oak, thence South 30 deg East 160 perches to an Elm standing by the side of the ab<sup>s</sup> Creek, thence up the s<sup>d</sup> Creek five hundred & ninety perches to the place of beginning, Containing four hundred & sixty three acres and the allowance of six acres per cent for Roads & highways
