



By virtue of a warrant dated the fourth of June 1743 the above described Tract of Land was surveyed unto Nicholas Holdeman in Con-
 entry Townshp, in Chester County. Beginning at a White Oak at a Corner of
 Owen Thomas's Land thence East North East by the same 102 perches to a White Oak
 thence North North East by d. and Jacob Dedweiler 97 perches to a stone, North 50 degrees
 west by Vacant Land 95 perches to a stone, thence west North west by d. 84 perches to a Chesnut
 thence North 83 degrees west 80 perches to a White Oak thence South South west 20 perches
 to a white Oak, thence West by S. L. 114 perches to a Black Oak, thence South South
 East by Joseph Thomas and John Scheffer 256 perches to the place of Beginning, containing two hundred and
 fifty eight acres, beside the allowance of six perches.
