



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the second day
of Septem^r 1734^{for 150^{ac}} Surveyed unto Jacob Smith a Tract of Land Situated in
New Cowissitoppin in the County of Philad^a. Beginning at a post in a
line of y^e German Tract thence by land of George Underberger South East
one hundred and eighty perches to a post, thence by Vacant Land South
West one hundred and forty two perches to a post, thence by Vacant
Land North West one hundred & eighty perches to a post
in y^e line of S^d German Tract thence by the same North East one
hundred and forty two perches to y^e place of Beginning containing
one hundred and fifty acres with the usual allowance of six p^{er}
Cent. Surveyed Novem^r 1st 1734
Jacob Smith's Warrant & Survey made void. Now granted to George H. Light
by Warrant dated the 13th of 10^{ber} 1739
