



Surveyed on the twenty seventh day of June 1833 to Nehemiah Hecton a certain Tract of Land, Situate on a Branch of the River Skunk Kill, called Borden's, in the County of Philad^a. Beginning at a Hickery, being a Corner of Isaac Starrs land thence by the same South thirty two degrees west one hundred and sixty perches to a post being another Corner of the said Isaac Starrs land, thence by Vacant land South West two hundred and thirteen perches to a post in the line of Moses Starrs land, thence by the same North seventy degrees west one hundred and forty nine perches to a post, a corner of said Moses's land thence by the same South sixty degrees west fourteen perches to a small hickery a corner of Jeremiah Starrs land, thence by the same North west one hundred and seventy perches to an Ash tree another Corner of Jeremiah Starrs land thence by Vacant land North sixty degrees East two hundred and sixty perches to a White Oak a corner of James Starrs land thence by the same South East thirty perches to a White Oak standing by the said branch of Skunk Kill, thence the same course across the said branch six perches to a Birch tree, thence up the severall courses of the said branch to the first mentioned Hickery or place of Beginning. Containing few hundred acres with usual allowances.
