By Virtue of a Warrant from the Hon^{ble} Proprietaries bearing date the twenty seventh day of February 1734. I have surveyed & laid out unto Moses Hartland on the upper Fork of Conewago Creek in the County of Lancaster on the West side Susquehanna River Eight hundred and fifty five acres of Land with allowance of 6 p. Cent. Beginning at a Hickory stand by the S. Creek on a small Island thence North West one hundred and ninety four perches to a White Oak, Thence South Sixty four degrees Westerly three hundred and twenty perches to a white Oak, Thence South Twenty six degrees Easterly four hundred and twenty seven perches to a Hickory, Thence North Sixty four degrees Easterly Three hundred and twenty perches to a Black Oak, Thence North Twenty six degrees Westerly one hundred ninety eight perches to a Black Oak by the S. Branch, Thence down the same Branch crossing the several courses thereof near about Eighty perches to the place of Beginning, Surveyed April 21st 1738
