



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the Twelfth day of August 1734. Surveyed unto Ludwig Diller a tract of land situated at Maxatawny in the County of Philadelphia Beginning at a post a Corner of a tract laid out to John Holder thence by Vacant Land South ten degrees East two hundred and twelve perches to a Hickory thence by Vacant Land South eighty degrees west one hundred and eighty perches to a post thence by Vacant Land North ten degrees west two hundred & twelve perches to a Black Oak Sapling thence by Vacant Land North eighty degrees east sixty seven perches and by land of John Holder the same course one hundred and thirteen perches to the place of Beginning, containing two hundred and twenty five acres with a usual allowance of six per cent. Surveyed September 17th 1734
