Surveyed the above described tract of land for John Cobb the 18th day of May A. D. 1820 By Virtue of his Warrant dated the 13th day of January 1820.

N.B. The piece of land Containing 54^{ac} 47^{ps} &c is included in the Survey made to Jeremiah Jackson. The piece of land Containing 40^{ac} 93^{ps} is included in the Survey made to Elizabeth Branham. The line run from the post to the Maple 212^{ps} & continued further was run & marked A.D. 1793. And Cobb proposes to prove that W^m Gray then Deputy Surv^r agree^d to not include the land West of said line in any Warrant but that he would leave it for John Cobb who then lived where he now does. John Cobb says he can prove this by several Witnesses. There is a warrant granted to William Hiorns dated June 15th 1774. for the above described land, but the land has never Surv^d upon the warrant. So says the owner of the Warrant.
