



Henry Spengler's Settlement

In Pursuance of a warrant from the Proprietaries dated the sixteenth day of October A^o Dⁱ 1735. Surveyed unto George Haagh a certain tract of land situate on a Branch of Tulpehocken Creek called the Noor^o Kill, or Creek, in the County of Lancaster Beginning at a post set for a corner by Henry Spingler's Settlement thence extending by o-b-l East One hundred and sixty pches to a white oak marked thence by Vacant Land North one hundred and fifty nine pches to a post West one hundred and sixty pches to a post thence South one hundred and fifty nine pches to the Place of Beginning Containing one hundred and fifty acres and the usual allowance of six P. Cent. Surveyed the 24th day of October A^o Dⁱ 1735. P. W^m Parsons —
