



In Pursuance of a warrant for 400 acres dated the eight day of April 1817 granted to Jacob Herrington was surveyed on the seventh day of May A. D. 1817. The above described tract of land containing 412 acres 113 perches and allowance of six per cent for roads, &c. situated in Shenango township, Crawford county, and at the time of making the same Al<sup>r</sup> Cithcart was residing there on, and there was built a house fit for the habitation of man, and there appeared to be upwards of fifteen acres of the land cleared, fenced and in a state of cultivation, and that the same was divided ~~as above stated~~ between the Respective owners of the same.
