



Situate on Champion Run or on a branch thereof and was Surveyed the 5th 6th & 7th days of December 1814 in pursuance of a Rule of Court granted for that purpose N^o 47 November term 1814 by which William Griffith was appointed to execute and report. Who in consequence thereof has stated the Circumstances at large and made return thereof to me. Note. this Survey has been attended with some singular circumstances. which I shall endeavor to explain as fully as the information will admit.

In the first place Easter M^c Kee, or some person in her name, procured an Order of Survey for 300⁰⁰ upon a branch of Champins Run including Champins Camp County of Cumberland &c. From the Certificate of the Secretary of the Land Office now before me viz: "John Cochran." I find he has not been explicit. no Number or date is mentioned respecting the application. the Circumstances that relates further are these the Claimant under Easter M^c Kee neglected to come forward to procure a Survey on the location until Hazleton and Murray conceiving the land to be vacant procured Warrant and patents for those parts designated by their names. and then began to quarrel about that part above represented. In the interim the claimant under Easter M^c Kee comes forward with his location & Hazleton to end strife with him and as well to defeat his opponent, purchased of the said Claimant & requests patent may be granted for the same. You will observe that an adherence to a late instructions relative to the distance to Waters &c. "not then in Use" are omitted.
