



Draft of a tract of land, Situated in District No 5 (Moore's) Donnegall T^p Butler County on the head watters of the Connequenessing Creek Containing four hundred & Seventy-Seven acres & one hundred & thirteen perches & the allowence of Six per. Ct. &c.

Surveyed the 28th day of December A.D. 1841 agreeable to the original lines and corners and according to the plan of the said District at the Instance of John Gilmore by virtue of settlement and Improvermet.

It appears from the Entry Book of James Irwin (Former Deputy Surveyor of this County) that a Warrant ~~had~~ dated the 3^d of Feb^y 1794 in the name of Robt Scott Jur. Calling for 400^{acs} had been executed on the above tract of land. But was afterwards applied to a tract of land in Centre Tp. - Settled by Samul Stoughton - This tract as surveyed by Mr. Irwin contains 439 acres & 105 per & the allowence, which appers from his Entry Book.
