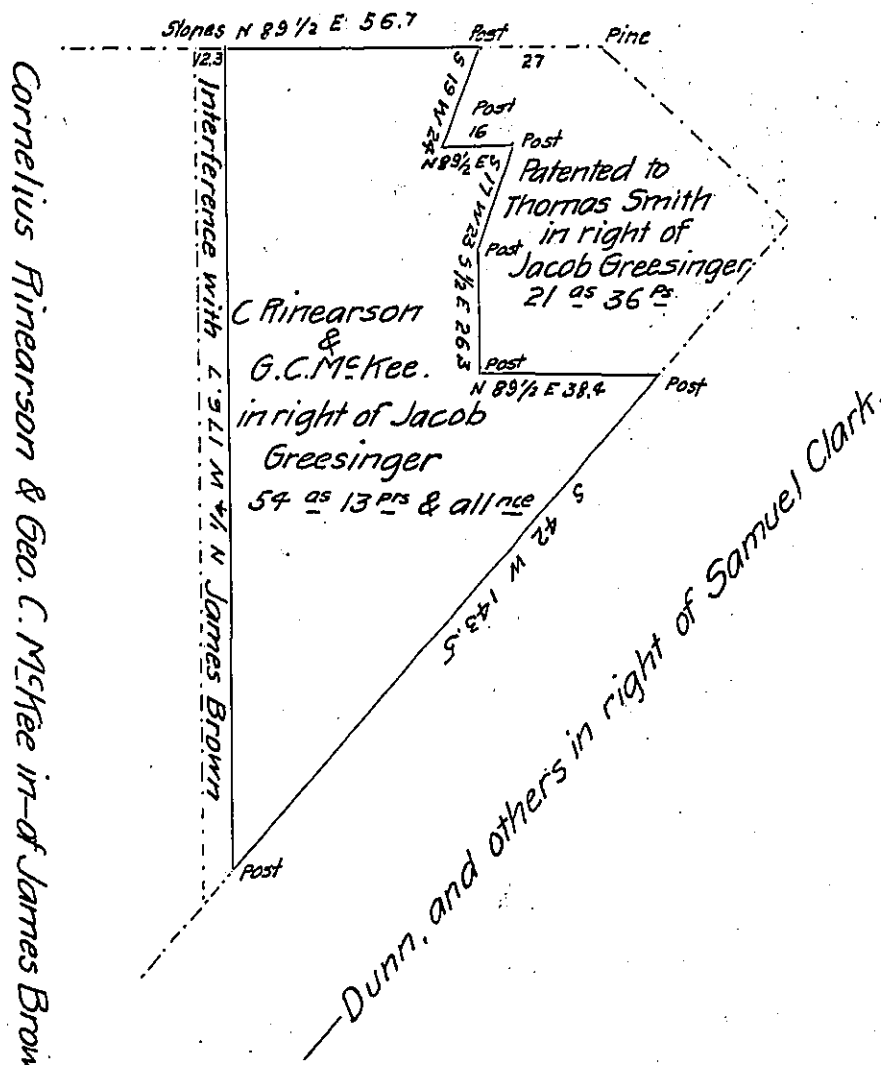


David Watson in right of—Carson

four acres & thirteen perches & the usual allowance of six per cent for roads &c.

(It being part of a tract of land containing eighty nine acres & one hundred &

thirty perches & allowance which was surveyed the 17<sup>th</sup> day of December A.D.

1817 unto Jacob Greesinger by virtue of his warrant bearing date the 2<sup>nd</sup> day

of April 1816.) Surveyed for Cornelius Pinearson & George Calhoun McKee

the 28<sup>th</sup> day of May A.D. 1841

P. S. In making the above survey I find that the original survey of Jacob

Greesinger interfred. with James Brown 12.3 perches as represented by the

dotted line on the West side of the survey. The Jacob Greesinger survey will

therefore contain but seventy five acres & 49 perches clear of the interference with

James Brown. The line of Brown is well established and the error appears to have

been in the measurement in making the original survey of Greesinger

D. Rockefeller.
