



A Draught of a Tract of land situated in Erie County near Laeboeuff Lake adjoining the State Reservation Surveyed the 3^d. Day of July 1801 for Matthew Simpson by virtue of his actual Settlement Residence and improvement containing 416 acres 48 ps. and allowance of six per cent &c. John Cochran D.S.

Resurveyed Feb^y. 7th. 1828 with some alterations and extended to the dotted line for Amos Judson by virtue of his Sherriff's Deed and found to contain 435 acres 12 perches and allowance &c. Wilson King D.S.

I do hereby Officially certify and make known that the above is a true copy of a draught and the annexed notes of a Survey noted in the Survey Book of Erie County I likewise certify that it appears to be a matter of general notariety that W^m Simpson and the above named Matthew Simpson Settled the above land jointly and that Matthew Simpson afterwards removed from the Land and W^m completed the Settlement and that I Believe no person claims it now but S^d Amos Judson.
