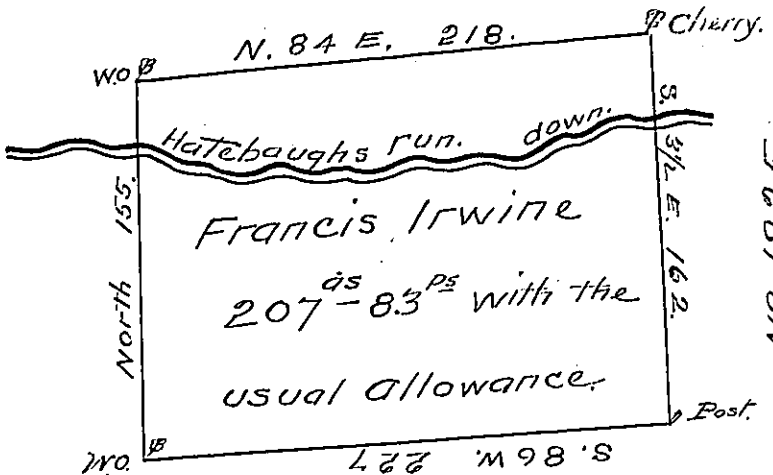

This a draft of donation lot No 1912 in the 2<sup>d</sup> district of Donation Land Slipry rock Township Mercer County Situate on the waters of Neshannack Creek said to be an undrawn tract Surveyed agreeably to the original lines on the ground the 13<sup>th</sup> day of November 1817 on an actual settlement made by Francis Irwin in the spring of 1814 Irwin residing on it with his family and improving it.

This survey was made at the time stated above when I was the Deputy Surveyor and entered in the Survey Book by me and when I was in Harrisburg had a search made but - could not find the return of survey - You will therefore please to accept of this return. As from the Books and papers in my possession it does not appear to be appropriated to any person, other than said Francis Irwine, if it be undrawn.
