



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietor dated the Eleventh day of January Anno Dom 1737 the above described Tract of land was surveyed unto John Jones adjoining his Other Land on a Branch of Coccoosing Creek in Lancaster County. Beginning at a Black Oak in a line of 5^d land thence South 40 degrees West by the same 175 Perches to a Hickery thence South 50 degrees East by Vac^t land 131 pches to a Black Oak thence North 40 degrees East by the same 184 Pches to a Post thence North 50 degrees West by ye same 60 Perches to a Post thence South 58 degrees West by the land of Philip Philipsmoyer 57 Pches to a Post thence North 5 deg^s West 44 Perches to ye place of Beginning. Containing One hundred & thirty two Acres beside the allowance of six P. Cent.
