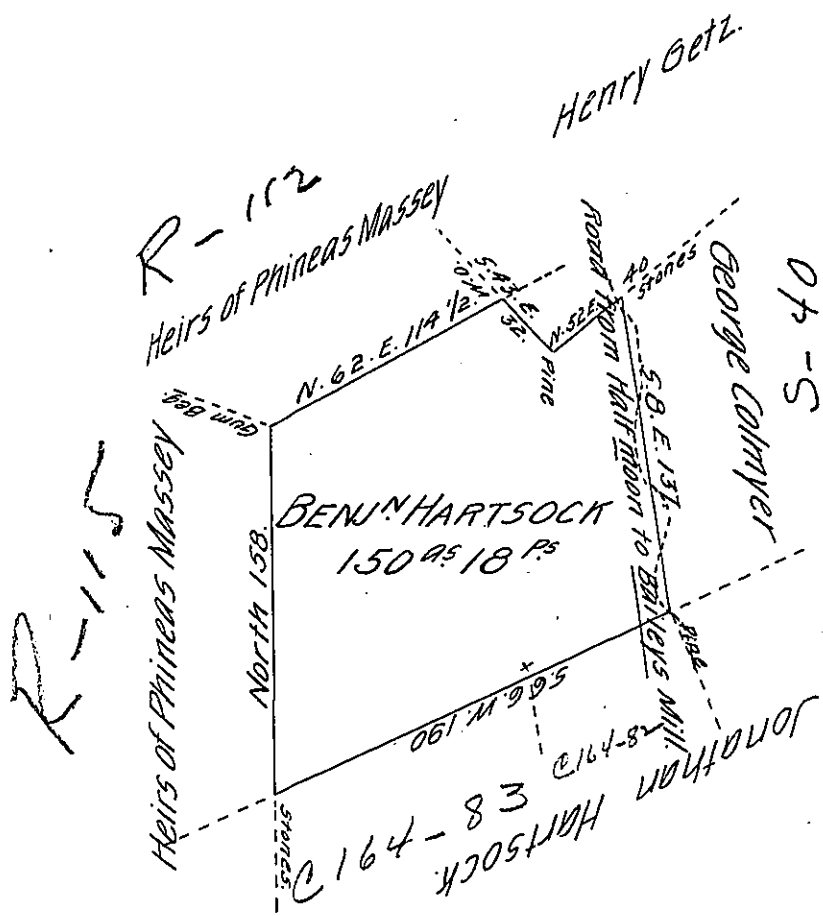


Warrant not filled, no more vacant land adjoining



Situate in Ferguson Township, Centre County, Containing One hundred and fifty Acres, Eighteen perches, and Allowance of Six per cent &c<sup>o</sup>. Surveyed the 17<sup>th</sup> day of September 1814, in pursuance of a warrant granted to Benjamin Hartsock, dated the 14 day of April 1814.

The improvements on the above described tract of land consists of a Dwelling House, & Stable, and about fourteen Acres of cleared land, the said Benjamin Hartsock, and family actuly residing thereon, and agreeably to the best information, the said tract was first improved on the 5<sup>th</sup> day of April 1811.

Note. Benj<sup>o</sup> Hartsock & George Colmyer, being on the ground at the time of making the above survey, it appeared, that the road from Halfmoon to Baillies Mill (as marked by dots on the easterly end of the Draft) had formerly been agreed on, to be the conditional line between them, but being on the ground, agreed to have the division line run straight, as represented on the Draught.
